Hi Families,



Again, thank you to everyone for your ongoing help and support.






I want to thank all the families and staff for making me feel so welcome it has been an amazing term getting to know everyone and we are so looking forward to all the excitement to come in term 4

Our honeybees have also been lucky to be a part of the Peninsula Health KACH ME program. This is a gross motor based program held each fortnight for 10 weeks. Throughout these sessions the program leader, Simone, is supporting the honeybees with new and exciting ways to support gross motor development focusing on body awareness, strength, etc. Information will be shared with our families on how they can also support the development of these skills at home.

On Friday 30th August we welcomed our dads, along with some Poppys and mums, to celebrate Father's Day! We enjoyed building, painting and playing games with our special visitors and even got them up doing the Tooty Ta dance! Lots of fun and laughs for all!

Our visits to the Somerville Primary School library have commenced. These adventures give us an opportunity to experience school life, as we visit the school office staff, explore the library and familiarise ourselves with toilets, drinking taps, playgrounds, etc. We will be continuing our school adventures in Term 4.

Amongst all of this busyness our honeybees have been enjoying exploring our kinder program. Lots of our friends have been showing a strong interest in storytelling and book making, which has extended into lots mark making and writing. We observed lots of progress and enthusiasm with pencil grip, letter formation and name writing. We have also been enjoying lots of outdoor play, obstacle courses, dress ups and messy play in the sandpit. We will continue to extend on these skills and interests as the year continues.







# Hats at Kinder

It is that time of the year again and we will now be implementing our Sun Protection Policy moving forward for the remainder of the year.

This means that all children will be required to bring a sun safe hat to wear for every kinder session. The sun safe hat must be one that protects the face, back of the neck, eyes and ears such as a broad brimmed hat, wide bucket hat or legionnaires hat . Please ensure that your child has a named, suitable hat for each session from now onwards.













## Sun-protective hats

To help protect your skin and eyes from UV damage, wear a broad-brim, bucket or legionnaire hat that shades the face, neck, eyes and ears.

The sun's ultraviolet (UV) radiation is the main cause of skin cancer.

Sun protection is recommended whenever the UV level reaches 3 or above.

Download the free SunSmart app or visit sunsmart.com.au to check what times you need to use sun protection each day.

During the sun protection times, protect yourself in five ways:

- 1. Slip on clothing that covers as much skin as possible.
- Slop on SPF30 (or higher) broadspectrum, water-resistant sunscreen 20 minutes before you go outdoors and reapply every two hours.
- 3. Slap on a broad-brimmed hat that shades your face, head, neck and ears.
- 4. Seek shade.
- 5. Slide on sunglasses that meet the Australian Standard for UV protection.

#### Which type of hat?

The best sun-protective hats shade the head, face, neck and ears. Because caps and visors do not protect the ears, cheeks or neck they are not considered suitable for sun protection.

#### **Broad-brimmed hat**

Brims should be wide and flat and create shade for the face, neck and ears.



#### **Bucket hat**

Bucket hats should have a deep crown and sit low on the head. The angled brim should provide the face, neck and ears with plenty of shade.



#### Legionnaire hat

Legionnaire hats should have a flap that covers the ears and back of the neck to the collarbone/ shoulder. The side flap and front peak should overlap to protect the side of the face.
